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BACKGROUND

Ensuring food and nutritional security, enhancing crop productivity, mitigating the impacts of climate change, and reducing post-harvest losses while promoting environmental sustainability all require a deeper understanding of the plant physiological processes that regulate growth, resource-use efficiency, stress tolerance, and quality enhancement. Strengthening the link between fundamental research and its practical application in agriculture is essential. This National Conference on “Applications of Plant Physiology for Crop Improvement, Quality Enhancement and Post-Harvest Management in Horticulture” is directed at capturing significant contributions to horticulture across these themes. It aims not only to recognise past contributions but also to lay a roadmap for future fundamental research in plant physiology that translates into practical outcomes for horticulture.

CALL FOR ABSTRACTS / PAPERS

Abstracts are invited for oral and poster presentations under the identified conference themes and sub-themes. Authors are requested to submit an abstract comprising the title, author(s) and affiliation(s), a maximum 250-word abstract, and 3–5 keywords. Abstracts should be prepared in MS Word using Times New Roman, 12-point font, with 1.5 line spacing, and submitted by e-mail to plantphyscon26@skuastkashmir.ac.in on or before 15 September 2026. Accepted abstracts will be published in the Conference Book of Abstracts. Selected authors may be invited to submit full-length manuscripts for publication.

Posters should be prepared in portrait orientation and designed to fit within the display area provided. Each poster presenter will be allotted a display space of 1.0 m × 1.0 m (height × width). Posters should clearly present the title, author(s), affiliation(s), objectives, methodology, key findings, and conclusions in a legible format suitable for viewing by conference participants. Authors are responsible for printing, transporting, and mounting their posters at the designated venue.

TECHNICAL SESSIONS & KEYNOTE LECTURES

Technical sessions on fruits, vegetables, floriculture and plantation crops will focus on the contributions of plant physiology in tissue culture and planting-material production, crop improvement through a better understanding of day-length, productivity enhancement through hormones and canopy architecture, hydroponics and aeroponics, and the role of physiology in post-harvest technology, among other topics. A list of keynote speakers will be communicated separately. A series of keynote addresses, plenary lectures, invited talks, and panel discussions by internationally acclaimed scientists and distinguished experts from premier institutions across India and abroad is planned as an integral part of the conference, highlighting recent breakthroughs and transformative innovations in plant physiology and its applications.

The conference is open to scientists, academicians, researchers, extension personnel, industry professionals, policymakers, postgraduate students, and research scholars in agriculture and allied disciplines. Prospective participants are encouraged to register early to allow the Organizing Committee to make the best possible arrangements for accommodation, conference materials, and technical sessions.
